- FIC ALDER CROSSING THE PANTHER'S PATH
Sixteen-year-old Billy Calder, son of a British soldier and a Mohawk woman, leaves school to join Tecumseh in his efforts to prevent the Americans from taking any more land from the Indians in the Northwest Territory
- FIC ALEXIE THE LONE RANGER AND TONTO FIST FIGHT IN HEAVEN
A collection of short stories portrays life on the Spokane Indian Reservation, relating the stories of a child with alcoholic parents, a letter-writer who is dying of cancer, and others.
- FIC ALCOTT LITTLE WOMEN
Chronicles the joys and sorrows of the four March sisters as they grow into young ladies in nineteenth-century New England.
- FIC ALCOTT LITTLE MEN
Tells of the jolly times with Jo's boys at Plumfield. Sequel to Little Women. Followed by Jo's Boys.
- FIC ANDERSON FEVER 1793
In 1793 Philadelphia, sixteen-year-old Matilda Cook, separated from her sick mother, learns about perseverance and self-reliance when she is forced to cope with the horrors of a yellow fever epidemic.
- FIC ARMSTRONG SOUNDER
Angry and humiliated when his sharecropper father is jailed for stealing food for his family, a young black boy grows in courage and understanding by learning to read and with the help of the devoted dog Sounder.
- FIC AZUELA THE UNDERDOGS
Considered by many to be the definitive novel of the Mexican Revolution, this is the story of a peace-loving Indian who is forced to side with the rebels to save his family
- FIC BAGNOLD NATIONAL VELVET
Story of "how Velvet Brown...won a piebald horse in a village lottery and rode him in the Grand National Steeplechase".
- FIC BAT-AMI TWO SUNS IN THE SKY
In the fall of 1944, approximately one thousand refugees from liberated Italy were brought to a refugee shelter in Oswego, New York. Two story lines intertwine-- that of fifteen-year-old Yugoslav refugee Adam and fifteen-year-old Oswego native Christine.
- FIC BORLAND THE AMULET
The story of Quincy Scott's long journey eastward to Missouri; of old Jake, a Mountain Man full of Indian mysticism; and of the bloody battle of Wilson's Creek.

FIC BORLAND	<p>WHEN THE LEGENDS DIE</p> <p>When his father killed another brave, Thomas Black Bull and his parents sought refuge in the wilderness. There they took up life as it had been in the old days.</p>
FIC BROWN	<p>THE WAY TO BRIGHT STAR</p> <p>Ben Butterfield, ex-circus performer, is living out his days in a small backwater town. He spends much of his time dwelling on the past, pondering his glory days with the circus, and his first grand adventure-an odyssey across Missouri and Illinois to Bright Star, Indiana during the Civil War.</p>
FIC BRUCHAC	<p>SACAJAWEA</p> <p>Sacajawea, a Shoshoni Indian interpreter, peacemaker, and guide, and William Clark alternate in describing their experiences on the Lewis and Clark Expedition to the Northwest.</p>
FIC CALDWELL	<p>CAPTAINS AND KINGS</p> <p>Irish Americans, emigration and immigration.</p>
FIC CATHER	<p>O PIONEERS</p> <p>Frontier and pioneer life, Nebraska</p>
FIC CHOY	<p>THE JADE PEONY</p> <p>Chinatown, Vancouver, of the early 1940s provides the backdrop for this fresh, uplifting, award-winning first novel, told through the reminiscences of the three young children of an immigrant Chinese family.</p>
FIC CHURCHILL	<p>SOMEONE TO WATCH OVER ME</p> <p>Broke after the crash of '29, Lily and Robert Brewster move to their uncle's home. Many adventures await them – including murder. Great deal of historical information.</p>
FIC CLAPP	<p>THE TAMARACK TREE</p> <p>An eighteen-year-old English girl finds her loyalties divided and all her resources tested as she and her friends experience the terrible physical and emotional hardness of the forty-seven day siege of Vicksburg in the spring in 1863.</p>
FIC COCKELL	<p>THE REVOLT OF SARAH PERKINS</p> <p>Frontier and pioneer life in Colorado.</p>
FIC COONEY	<p>GODDESS OF YESTERDAY</p> <p>Caroline Cooney tells the story of Troy through the eyes of Anaxandra, the daughter of a king of one of the tiny Greek islands</p>
FIC COONEY	<p>THE RANSOM OF MERCY CARTER</p> <p>In 1704, in the English settlement of Deerfield, Massachusetts, eleven-year-old Mercy and her family and neighbors are captured by Mohawk Indians and their French allies, and forced to march through bitter cold to French Canada, where some adapt to new lives and some still hope to be ransomed.</p>
FIC COOPER	<p>THE DEERSLAYER</p> <p>A rousing tale of warfare between the Iroquois Indians and the white settlers about Lake Otsego before 1745. The main characters are Hawkeye, Uneas, and the two sisters, Judith and Hetty, who defy the Indians.</p>
FIC COOPER	<p>THE LAST OF THE MOHICANS</p> <p>Hawkeye and his two friends, the last of the Mohican braves, struggle against the Huron, Uncan, to protect two English girls and their escorts.</p>

FIC COOPER	<p>THE SPY</p> <p>Written in 1821-1822. A story of the American Revolution. The hero, the spy, is a cool, shrewd, fearless man, who is employed by General Washington in service which involves great personal danger and little glory.</p>
FIC CRANE	<p>THE RED BADGE OF COURAGE</p> <p>A remarkable bit of imaginative writing--describing the fear, confusion, and fatigue that beset a young soldier in his first battle, Chancellorsville.</p>
FIC DALLAS	<p>ALICE'S TULIPS</p> <p>Alice is a young bride whose husband, a Union soldier, leaves her on his Iowa farm with his formidable mother. Equally talented at quilting and gossip, Alice fills her letters to her sister with accounts of local quilting bees, the rigors of farm life, and the customs of small-town America. But no town is too small for intrigue and treachery, and when Alice finds herself accused of murder, she must rely on support from unlikely sources</p>
FIC DALLAS	<p>THE DIARY OF MATTIE SPENCER</p> <p>No one is more surprised than Mattie Spencer herself when Luke Spencer, considered the great catch of their small Iowa town, asks her to marry him.</p>
FIC DOCTOROW	<p>THE WATERWORKS</p> <p>A novel of post-Civil War New York, where maimed veterans beg in the streets, newsboys fight for their corners, the Tweed Ring operates the city for its own profit, and a conspicuously self-satisfied class of new wealth and weak intellect is all aglitter in a setting of mass misery.</p>
FIC DODSON	<p>AWAY ALL BOATS</p> <p>A novel dealing with U.S. naval operations in the Pacific during World War II. It describes the details of life aboard the attack transport "Belinda", and the stages by which amphibious operations grew in efficiency from the Gilberts to Okinawa.</p>
FIC FAULKNER	<p>THE UNVANQUISHED</p> <p>United States, Civil War-1861-1865.</p>
FIC FERBER	<p>CIMARRON</p> <p>Beginning with the famous 'Run' that opened up the Oklahoma country and coming down to the time oil was struck, the story follows the growth of a pioneer town. Characters Yancey Cravat and Sabra his wife.</p>
FIC FERGUS	<p>ONE THOUSAND WHITE WOMEN:THE JOURNALS OF MAY DODD</p> <p>Based on an actual historical event but told through fictional diaries, this is the story of a remarkable woman who travels west in 1875 and marries the chief of the Cheyenne nation.</p>
FIC FLEISCHMAN	<p>THE BORNING ROOM</p> <p>Lying at the end of her life in the room where she was born in 1851, Georgina remembers what it was like to grow up on the Ohio frontier.</p>
FIC FLEISCHMAN	<p>PATH OF THE PALE HORSE</p> <p>Lep, an apprentice to a doctor, helps his master take care of yellow fever victims in Philadelphia during the epidemic of 1793.</p>
FIC FORBES	<p>JOHNNY TREMAIN</p> <p>This story of a young Boston apprentice, during the exciting year of the Tea Party culminates in the Battle of Lexington. It is a story of Boston in revolt and a very</p>

young man in love.

- FIC FORESTER THE CAPTAIN FROM CONNECTICUT
War of 1812.
- FIC FRAZIER COLD MOUNTAIN
In the waning months of the Civil War, a wounded Confederate veteran named Inman gets up from his hospital bed and begins the long journey back to his home in the remote hills of North Carolina.
- FIC GEAR THE SUMONING GOD
Book two in the Anasazi Mysteries series, this is the sequel to *The Visitant*. Archaeologist-authors Kathleen O'Neal Gear and W. Michael Gear introduce readers to murder, mayhem, and the myriad details of life in a 13th century Native American pueblo.
- FIC GAINES THE AUTOBIOGRAPHY OF MISS JAME PITTMAN
Historical novel about a black Louisiana woman, from the time of her childhood as a slave in the pre-Civil War South to 1962, when she witnessed the birth of the
civil rights movement at the age of 110.
- FIC GREENE SUMMER OF MY GERMAN SOLDIER
Sheltering an escaped German prisoner of war is the beginning of some shattering experiences for a 12-year-old Jewish girl in Arkansas.
- FIC GUTHRIE THE WAY WEST
The story opens in Independence, with the organization of a wagon train, and it follows that train to Oregon and the break up...There are tragedies and joys, there is birth and death, there is romance and frustration. Each human contact engenders its own train of development.
- FIC HAUGAARD CHASE ME, CATCH NOBODY
On a school trip to Germany in 1937, a 14-year-old Danish schoolboy becomes involved in the activities of the Anti-Nazi underground.
- FIC HAWTHORNE THE HOUSE OF THE SEVEN GABLES
Deals with the blight of an inherited curse among the Puritans of old New England. Massachusetts.
- FIC HEIDISH A WOMAN CALLED MOSES
A novel based on the life of Harriet Tubman
- FIC HEIDISH WITNESSES
Set in the Massachusetts Bay Colony in the 1630's. About Anne Hutchinson, the champion of religious liberty, leader in politics and medicine, etc. Also John Winthrop and other historical figures.
- FIC HESSE OUT OF THE DUST
In a series of poems, fifteen-year-old Billie Jo relates the hardships of living on her family's wheat farm in Oklahoma during the dust bowl of the Depression.
- FIC HIGGINS FLIGHT OF EAGLES

Max and Harry Kelso are flying in World War II--on opposite sides. After their parents divorced, Max went with his mother to Germany and Harry remained in America with his father. They have kept track of one another but neither could predict the circumstances under which they would meet again.

- FIC HILLERMAN FINDING MOON
Moon Mathias sets off for Vietnam when he discovers his brother, who died during the Vietnam conflict, left a young daughter somewhere in the war-torn country.
- FIC HOBBS JASON'S GOLD
When news of the discovery of gold in the Yukon in 1897 reaches fifteen-year-old Jason, he embarks on a 5,000-mile journey to strike it rich.
- FIC HOLLAND AN ORDINARY WOMAN
Holland returns to California for her 24th historical biography of Nancy Kelsey, the first American woman to cross the wilderness of the Great Western Desert and Rockies, afterwards settling in California with her husband Ben and raising a large family.
- FIC HOLM BOSTON JANE
Miss Jane Peck of Philadelphia has been schooled in etiquette for young ladies of 1854. However, she finds little use for this during her difficult sea voyage to the Pacific Northwest and while living among the American traders and Chinook Indians of Washington Territory
- FIC HOLMAN THE MURDERER
A young Jewish boy encounters numerous problems growing up during the Depression in a Pennsylvania mining town.
- FIC HODGE JUDAS FLOWERING
Set against the background of war-torn Savannah during the Revolution, this novel sees brother turn against brother, father against son, while a beautiful young woman finds herself caught between the lines drawn by the enmity of Rebel and Tory.
- FIC JOHNSTON CARRY THE WIND
Thick with Northwest wilderness period detail (1820-40), this gutsy adventure-entertainment is also larded with just the right amounts of frontier sentiment. Man-tracking, show-down in the snow, freezing-feet ordeals, and a whirl of doom.
- FIC JONES THE BAREFOOT BRIGADE
An Epical novel of the Civil War and of the fighting men of the Confederacy. About a ragged company of men deprived of every fighting advantage except braveness.
- FIC JONES THE COURT-MARTIAL OF GEORGE ARMSTRONG CUSTER
Suppose that Custer did not die at the Battle of the Little Bighorn. Suppose that instead he was found at the sight of the defeat and was brought to trial for his actions. Masterful blend of fact and fiction.
- FIC JONES ELKHORN TAVERN
Martin Hasford is away fighting with the confederate army. Ora Hasford holds her home together farming the land with her children's help. Battle of Pea Ridge, Wild Bill Hickok, Philip Sheridan.

FIC JONES	In 1865, Roman heads out of Arkansas to Kansas. He experiences a journey through the building of the railroad, the settling of Kansas and the West and the conflict with the Plains Indians. He eventually does find the Cheyenne--those indians with the beautiful name.
FIC JONES	<p>WINDING STAIR</p> <p>The time is 1890, the place is Fort Smith, Arkansas. There is a "Hanging Judge" and his assistant. The Choctaw Nation lives in the Winding Stair Mountains and there is a murder.</p>
FIC KANTOR	<p>ANDERSONVILLE</p> <p>A re-creation of one of the most tragic and dramatic episodes in Civil War history, the fourteen-month existence of Andersonville prison camp for Union soldiers.</p>
FIC KANTOR	<p>VALLEY FORGE</p> <p>An account of the terrible winter of 1777-78 at Valley Forge and the way in which, largely by Washington's genius, an efficient hopeful army was created out of a disorganized nucleus of half-starved, near-frozen men.</p>
FIC KERR	<p>SLAP YOUR SIDES</p> <p>Life in their Pennsylvania hometown changes for Jubal Shoemaker and his family when his older brother witnesses to his Quaker beliefs by becoming a conscientious objector during World War II</p>
FIC KNOWLES	<p>A SEPARATE PEACE</p> <p>A story about the friendship and treachery of two boys at an elite boarding school during World War II.</p>
FIC LADUKE	<p>LAST STANDING WOMAN</p> <p>Ojibwa Indians, Minnesota.</p>
FIC LARSEN	<p>THE WHITE</p> <p>In 1758, sixteen-year-old Mary Jemison was taken by a Shawnee raiding party from her home near what would become Gettysburg, Pa.</p>
FIC LOCKRIDGE	<p>RAINTREE COUNTY</p> <p>Story of a single-day, utilizing flashback device. The main character, Johnny Shawnessy, of mid-nineteenth century Indiana, more or less symbolizes the American of his day, the farm boy, the soldier, the politician, and finally the idealistic, poetic school master, happy in his family, devoted to his country.</p>
FIC MAILER	<p>THE NAKED AND THE DEAD</p> <p>Hailed as one of the finest American novels to come out of World War II, the story concerns a platoon of 13 American soldiers who are stationed on the Japanese-held island of Anopopei in the Pacific.</p>
FIC MASON	<p>IN COUNTRY</p> <p>Set in the small town of Hopewell, Kentucky in 1984 with a 17-year-old whose father was killed in Vietnam. She lives with her uncle who also fought in the conflict.</p>
FIC MATTHEWS	<p>THE FURTHER ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN</p>

FIC MCCARTHY	<p>BLOOD MERIDIAN Based on historical events that took place on the Texas-Mexico border in the 1850s, it traces the fortunes of the Kid, a fourteen-year-old Tennessean who stumbles into a nightmarish world where Indians are being murdered and the market for their scalps is thriving.</p>
FIC MICHENER	<p>HAWAII The epic saga of the fiftieth state traces its fascinating history from the fiery volcanoes that formed the islands to the strength and character of the original Polynesians.</p>
FIC MITCHELL	<p>GONE WITH THE WIND A story of the years before, during and after the Civil War, with the scenes laid in Georgia.</p>
FIC MORRISON	<p>BELOVED A dense, complex novel that yields up its secrets one by one. The horrifying circumstances of Sethe's baby's death start to make terrible sense. And as past meets present in the shape of a mysterious young woman about the same age as Sethe's daughter would have been, the narrative builds inexorably to its powerful, painful conclusion.</p>
FIC MYERS	<p>FALLEN ANGELS The story of one black teenager's twelve month tour of duty in Vietnam, includes realistic language.</p>
FIC NIXON	<p>A FAMILY APART When their mother can no longer support them, six siblings are sent by the Children's Aid Society of New York City to live with farm families in Missouri in 1860.</p>
FIC NIXON	<p>HIGH TRAIL TO DANGER In 1879 17-year-old Sarah travels from Chicago to the violent town of Leadville, Colorado, to locate her missing father, but she finds that the mention of his name brings her strange looks and an attempt on her life.</p>
FIC O'BRIEN	<p>THE CONTRACT SURGEON Dr. McGillycuddy is a surgeon pulled West by the Army for the Great Sioux War of 1876. He learns that he knows the legendary Sioux Leader, Crazy Horse, from a previous non-war situation and becomes his friend. Much to the doubt of the Army.</p>
FIC O'BRIEN	<p>GOING AFTER CACCIATO This novel tells the story of a young soldier who one day lays down his rifle and sets off on a quixotic journey from the jungles of Indochina to the streets of Paris.</p>
FIC O'BRIEN	<p>THE THINGS THEY CARRIED These stories follow Tim O'Brien's platoon of American soldiers through a variety of personal and military encounters during the Vietnam War.</p>
FIC PAULSEN	<p>THE RIFLE A priceless, handcrafted rifle, fired throughout the American Revolution, is passed down through the years until it fires on a fateful Christmas Eve of 1994.</p>
FIC PAULSEN	<p>SOLDIER'S HEART</p>

The story of when, in June 1861, as the Civil War began, Charley Goddard left his farm and enlisted in the first Minnesota Volunteers.

- FIC PECK A DAY NO PIGS WOULD DIE
To a thirteen-year-old Vermont farm boy whose father slaughters pigs for a living, maturity comes early as he learns "doing what's got to be done", especially regarding his pet pig who cannot produce a litter.
- FIC PECK A YEAR DOWN YONDER
During the recession of 1937, fifteen-year-old Mary Alice is sent to live with her feisty, larger-than-life grandmother in rural Illinois and comes to a better understanding of this fearsome woman –great humor!
- FIC POWER THE GRASS DANCER
From the lore of her people, the Sioux, Susan Power presents an extraordinary debut novel rich in drama and infused with magic. Set on a North Dakota reservation, this book weaves the stories of the old and the young, broken families, romantic rivals, and men and women in love and at war.
- FIC PRATT THE LAST VALENTINE
On February 14, 1944, Caroline Thomas said good-bye to her beloved husband, a Navy pilot sent to the Pacific. For fifty years, she waited for him to return-until a miracle happened and she received his last valentine. Their story has a powerful effect on Susan and their son, Neil.
- FIC PROULX ACCORDION CRIMES
This novel spans a century and a continent bringing the immigrant experience in America to life through the eyes of the descendants of Mexicans, Poles, Africans, Irish-Scots, Franco-Canadians and many others, all linked by their successive ownership of a simple green accordion.
- FIC REES Witch Child
In 1659, fourteen-year-old Mary Newbury keeps a journal of her voyage from England to the New World and her experiences living as a witch in a community of Puritans near Salem, Massachusetts.
- FIC ROLVAAG, GIANTS IN THE EARTH
A saga of the Norwegian settlement in America and the struggles of one man.
- FIC ROSTKOWSKI AFTER THE DANCING DAYS
A forbidden friendship with a badly disfigured soldier in the aftermath of World War I forces 13-year-old Annie to redefine the word "hero" and to question conventional ideas of patriotism.
- FIC RYAN EXPERANZA RISING
Esperanza and her mother are forced to leave their life of wealth and privilege in Mexico to work in the labor camps of Southern California, where they must adapt to the harsh circumstances facing Mexican farm workers on the eve of the Great Depression.
- FIC SAROYAN HUMAN COMEDY
The story of an American family in wartime, and in particular of Homer Macauley, the fastest messenger boy in the telegraph office in San Joaquin Valley.
- FIC SEBESTYEN WORDS BY HEART
A young black girl struggles to fulfill her papa's dream of a better future for their

family in the southwestern town where, in 1910, they are the only blacks.

- FIC SHAARA KILLER ANGELS
The great Pulitzer Prize-winning novel that covers the four most bloody and courageous days of the Civil War--the Battle of Gettysburg.
- FIC SHOUP STRANDED IN HARMONY
While struggling with the changes he faces during his senior year in a small Indiana town, Lucas gains insight through a unique friendship with a former Vietnam War protester.
- FIC SILKO CEREMONY
The story of a young Native American returning to his reservation after surviving the horrors of captivity as a prisoner of the Japanese during World War II.
- FIC SINCLAIR THE HORSE SOLDIERS
This novel is based on one of the most daring cavalry operations of all time: a seventeen-day raid by a Union brigade through the heart of Confederate Mississippi.
- FIC SINCLAIR THE JUNGLE
A novel set at the turn of the century about the hardships and horror one family went through. Set in the slaughter houses in Chicago.
- FIC SMILEY ALL-TRUE TRAVELS AND ADVENTURES OF LIDIE NEWTON
Set in Kansas during the middle 1850's, Smiley's new novel describes the bitter, sometimes bloody split between abolitionist and pro-slavery factions that turns the territory into an early, undeclared battleground of the Civil War to come.
- FIC SMITH A TREE GROWS IN BROOKLYN
The story of a young girl and her family living in Brooklyn during the early 1900's.
- FIC SPEARE THE SIGN OF THE BEAVER
Left alone to guard the family's wilderness home in 18th-century Maine, a boy is hard-pressed to survive until local Indians teach him their skills.
- FIC STOWE THE MINISTER'S WOOING
Harriet Beecher Stowe's domestic comedy is a powerful examination of slavery, Protestant theology, and gender differences in early America.
- FIC TERRIS NELL'S QUILT
Urged at the age of eighteen to marry a man she doesn't want, Nell delays the event by working on a quilt, slowly starving herself, and observing the unhappy lot of many women in turn-of-the-century Massachusetts before arriving at a decision to rescue herself from the brink of death and take charge of her life.
- FIC THESMAN A Sea So Far
After surviving the 1906 San Francisco earthquake and fires, two teenage girls, a wealthy semi-invalid and her hired companion, travel together to Ireland and discover they share much in common, from a love of romance novels to grief over the loss of their mothers.
- FIC THOM SIGN-TALKER
This begins just after the Louisiana Purchase. Thomas Jefferson has sent Meriwether Lewis and William Clark to penetrate the newly acquired territory,

journey up the Missouri River, cross the Rocky Mountains, and reach the glimmering sea in the far West. To survive, the two captains need an extraordinary hunter. They choose George Drouillard.

- FIC TWAIN ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN
The adventures of a boy and a runaway slave as they travel down the Mississippi river on a raft.
- FIC TWAIN THE ADVENTURES OF TOM SAWYER AND THE ADVENTURES OF HUCKLEBERRY FINN
- FIC UCHIDA PICTURE BRIDE
Carrying a photograph of the man she is to marry but has yet to meet, young Hana Omiya arrives in San Francisco, California, in 1917, one of several hundred Japanese "picture brides" whose arranged marriages brought them to America in the early 1900s.
- FIC VAN REID MOLLIE PEER, OR THE UNDERGROUND ADVENTURES OF THE MOOSEPATH LEAGUE
Humorous mystery about the adventures of the Moosepath League and Mollie Peer, a feisty, society columnist in Portland, Maine in 1896.
- FIC WALKER MERIDIAN
A novel of politics and the story of a courageous black woman who becomes a voice in the struggle of her race to gain equality in a changing South.
- FIC WERKLEY GIRL-ON-FIRE
Extraordinarily accurate about the daily life and responsibilities of Comanche women and the Comanche language appropriately used.
- FIC WEST THE MASSACRE AT FALL CREEK
A dramatic, sweeping saga of life on the Indiana frontier in 1824, based on actual historical events.
- FIC WINDLE TRUE WOMEN
Three generations of strong-willed women populate this intriguing novel based on stories of the author's ancestors.
- FIC ZINDEL THE GADGET
In 1945, having joined his father in Los Alamos, where he and other scientists are working on a secret project to end World War II, thirteen-year-old Stephen becomes caught in a web of secrecy and intrigue
